### Message from Chappy Bev

I thought I would give you a quick reminder about the various services provided through Chaplaincy. I currently work three days per week; Wednesday to Friday. #### Emotion words and facial expressions

Since the beginning of the year we have been working on our reading concentrating on various aspects. One element we have paid close attention to is 'emotion' words (sad, happy, scared, angry, cranky, shy, etc) and recognising the expressions that characters make when we see these pictures in stories. So one activity in 1A we tried out was our own situations where emotion words and facial expressions could be captured. We chose some lucky children and using the magic of the 'Remove background' feature in PowerPoint 2010 placed them in some unreal situations. Hope you like them. The kids had good fun making them together as a class.

We used the 'Remove Background' feature to get rid of the background of the photo of the kids that we took in the classroom. English


We finished our unit on emotions with the children presenting their book talks to the class. They have been doing a great job of talking about their chosen characters and how they felt in the book. The audience has been practising their very good listening manners too.

Our next unit is about persuasion. We have read two books written by Lois Grambling - "Can I have a Stegosaurus Mum? Can I? Please?" and "Can I have a Tyrannosaurus Rex Dad? Can I? Please?". We talked about all of the ideas the children had to convince their parents why it would be a good idea.

The children then drew and wrote about something that they'd really like and how they could persuade their Mum or Dad to let them. Here are some of our stories.



"Can I have a dragon Dad? Can I? Please? It could fly me to school and it could breathe fire. If the BBQ wouldn't work, it could blow the sausages and the sausages would get cooked." Ryan

### Maths

Our main focus has been number. The Preps are working on recognising and writing numerals, counting forwards and backwards, counting collections, and comparing collections of more/ less/ the same. The Year 1's are working on their skip counting, identifying the teen numbers and solving addition and subtraction problems.

### Science

We are watching our tadpoles grow but we haven't seen any legs yet. We are very excited to be emailing our very own Scientist, Dr Peter from the CSIRO. He has been helping with our tadpole investigation. We enjoyed listening to some sound files that he sent with frog calls and toad calls. They sound very different. Did you know that it's the male frog that makes all the noise? Dr Peter said it was like this in his classroom when he went to school!

### Maths Time with 1/2C

We have been busy learning how to count in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's using interactive rap songs and AV stories. One of our favourites is 'Katy's day at the beach'. (It has cute and funny sea creatures!)

Exploring numbers to 120 has been fun, using blocks, number lines and hundred charts.

Students are developing skills in place value particularly

focussing on 'tens and ones' using paddle pop sticks and MAB's.

We explored measurement using length, comparing objects and beginning to estimate and then accurately measure with everyday objects and MAB cubes.

The class has been brainstorming several ways to partition double digits and learning how to represent them in word form.

At the moment we are currently learning simple number fact strategies like doubles, rainbow facts and count ons to assist with solving addition and subtraction problems.

### Nihongo News

We identified the basic needs of pets and considered their secondary needs such as exercise, grooming, love and play. **HAVE YOU RECEIVED THE SCHOOLKIDS BONUS?**  
Do you know about the Schoolkids Bonus? It is a new cash payment to help eligible families and students with the costs of primary and secondary school studies. Around 1.2 million families have already benefitted from the first wave of payments in January 2013 – have you?  
If you receive a family or income support payment, including Family Tax Benefit Part A, you could be eligible to receive \$410 a year for each primary student and \$820 a year for each secondary student, with half paid in January and half paid in July.  
The Schoolkids Bonus replaces the Education Tax Refund (ETR) and is a much simpler system. You no longer need to collect receipts and payments are made automatically so you don't have to wait months to make a claim via your tax return. Unlike the ETR you can choose how you use the payment to best support your children's education – whether it be school books, stationery, uniforms, school fees, or excursions.  
Check your eligibility by visiting [australia.gov.au/schoolkidsbonus](http://australia.gov.au/schoolkidsbonus) and if you think you might have missed out on the January payment, contact Centrelink – either in person at a Centrelink-Medicare Office or by calling 132 468.

*The Asperger Australia Support Group supports parents and extended family to develop understanding of individuals on the Autism Spectrum. 


